There were no substantive differences between the plan for this year and it's execution. Small differences include timing of GLAD training, elimination of HR training and CBO training, BTSA clearing of credentials.

Additionally, while Taekwondo was offered at ILA for a limited time, staff for this position was not retained due to scheduling conflict. ILA is now pursuing a partnership with a local gym to provide students with a more robust way of engaging in martial arts within our afterschool enrichment program. Additionally, ILA has expanded our school day offerings of the arts to include music within the school day and within the afterschool program.

ILA is in the process of purchasing more components of the celebration of student achievement and growth, specifically blazers and jackets along with badges/pins for achievement. ILA also just finished spending the remaining PCSGP funds, so those expenses for school supplies will be included within our final expenditures for the year.

Invictus has increased the number of students performing at grade level with the implementation of differentiation via small group instruction, mastery learning, and blended learning. Additionally, ILA is implementing more STEAM learning projects and expanding STEM with dance and music both during the school day and after school.

ILA is continuing to celebrate each child's personalized growth goals at the conclusion of each trimester based upon our baseline iReady data, allowing each child to celebrate their growth in comparison to themselves versus an external metric.

Invictus has successfully recruited and retained highly qualified and credentialed staff, which greatly contributes to the effectiveness and quality of the student educational experience.

Invictus has added more STEAM projects, dance, and music during both school day and in the afterschool program. Invictus has hired an Afterschool Lead, and made more purchases toward supplies for the Afterschool program as well as for the regular school day. Invictus has also modified our regular monitoring of key metrics through our new Executive Leadership Team, which includes the weekly monitoring of attendance, walkthrough/instruction quality, days or reserve, and min used in our supplementary blended learning programs.
